

# Weather Idioms - Lesson#1

Here are some examples of English idioms that use the weather. As you work through these lessons you will notice they go in alphabetical order. Lesson 1 below has words starting with the letters A – B.



## As right as rain

This means to be healthy, especially after being ill.

Example: *I have been off work for week, but I'm right as rain now.*

## Be a breeze

If something is a breeze, it is very easy to do.

Example: *My English test was a breeze. I answered all the questions in less than 10 minutes.*

## Be snowed under

To be snowed under means to have too much to do.

Example: *I'm snowed under at the moment because I have three reports to write and four tests to study for.*
